## Year 7 UNIT 3:

## **MINIMALISM**

Big ideas (key concepts)	To understand the concept of Minimalism through playing the Minimalist piece: In C	To learn about ostinato through playing a Phillip Glass Minimalist piece	To understand "phasing technique" through clapping a piece by Steve Reich	To create a piece of music in the style of John Adams (1 of 2)
Lesson topics sequence	<ul> <li>Pupils will</li> <li>learn about the concept of Minimalist music and will be introduced to its composers</li> <li>listen to a piece of music by Terry Riley, a Minimalist pioneer</li> <li>learn to play his piece "In C" as a class ensemble</li> <li>reflect via 2 stars and a wish at the end of the lesson</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Pupils will</li> <li>learn about Phillip Glass who wrote many film scores using minimalist techniques</li> <li>listen to "Truman Sleeps" a piece written by P. Glass for the film Truman</li> <li>break down the piece into small rhythmic ostinatos and play in pairs</li> <li>perform to the class at the end of the lesson</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Pupils will</li> <li>learn about Steve Reich who used "phasing technique" to write his pieces</li> <li>listen to Steve Reich's "Clapping song" which uses subtle changes in rhythms over time to create an interesting sound</li> <li>work to perform "Clapping song" as a class</li> <li>try the modern cup song which maintains a similarly strong rhythm throughout</li> <li>assess their ability to read simple notation</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Pupils will</li> <li>learn about John Adams who wrote many minimalist operas</li> <li>listen to "short ride in a fast machine" and note the use of tempo, pulse, glissandi and ostinati</li> <li>plan out their own pieces based on John Adams' work, considering pulse, swirls, flashes and wheels!</li> <li>discuss with the class their plans for their pieces</li> </ul>

Lesson topics sequence	<ul> <li>recap on John Adam's piece         "short ride in a fast         machine" by listening to it         again</li> <li>start to create their own         pieces using the musical         elements to aid them</li> <li>notate their rhythms and         annotate their creative         processes in the back of         their blue books</li> <li>perform their pieces to the         class</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Pupils will</li> <li>recap on "Truman sleeps" by Phillip Glass and the key features of the piece</li> <li>first learn the simplified chords of Am, F, C, G which will form the backing track to the improvisation</li> <li>learn what it takes to improvise and how the elements such as rhythm, tonality, texture, timbre, dynamics can be used to aid them</li> <li>Perform to the class</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Pupils will</li> <li>listen to "in C" again to remind them of the key features</li> <li>base their pieces in C pentatonic scale which is made of 5 notes</li> <li>C D E G A</li> <li>look at the musical elements and think how they can apply them to their pieces e.g rhythm, melody, harmony, tonality,</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Pupils will</li> <li>recap on the key features of "In C" and discuss to discuss their pieces so far</li> <li>aim to complete their pieces today</li> <li>notate their work with annotations about their creative process</li> <li>self-assess their creative skills</li> </ul>
