Keeping our Young People Safe *Message from the Safeguarding Team*

This week staff held an INSET day, which focused on our statutory safeguarding processes at Stanchester Academy. In June 2021, Ofsted conducted a review of sexual abuse in schools and colleges, which revealed how prevalent sexual harassment and online sexual abuse are for children and young people. The term Harmful Sexual Behaviour (HSB) refers to the Sexual behaviours expressed by children and young people under the age of 18 years old that are developmentally inappropriate, may be harmful towards self or others, or abusive towards another child, young person or adult. Ofsted found that, for some children nationally, incidents are so commonplace that they see no point in reporting them. It's important that our students don't feel this at Stanchester Academy, so alongside our pastoral support systems, we will be launching an anonymous reporting tool called WHISPER for students and parents, which will be accessible through our website. Message from the Pastoral Team

Unfortunately, you may be aware of physical altercations between students in recent weeks. These have been dealt with swiftly and students have been appropriately sanctioned. We do not tolerate or accept physical violence on the school site and continue to urge parents and carers to tell us about any issues that affect their young people. This means that we can accurately help to resolve issues between peer groups. These incidents cause significant distress to the children in our community and this behaviour is not acceptable.

What might seem like a small incident outside of school has the potential to be magnified when students travel together on buses or meet up on site from separate areas of the local community.

Lastly, please remind students that if they are using their mobile phones in school or using their phone to send peer on peer abuse they will face a phone ban in school.
