Teaching at Stanchester Academy is innovative, forward thinking and inspirational. Students are at the centre of all we do and drive the learning. Children's individualism is celebrated through personalised learning where students can identify their journey through carefully planned pathways promoting independence whilst providing an outstanding degree of support inspired by the belief our teachers have in our students.

Our curriculum is broad ensuring all students can access the subjects which will support them in achieving their aspirations. Our curriculum is driven by our belief that all learners are individuals and have individual futures ahead of them. Whilst ensuring every student completes the core curriculum to the highest possible standard we also guide and support our students to ensure their options for their futures are wide and varied.



Beyond the classroom

Developing children's characters through experiences and opportunities is fundamental to learning at Stanchester. Health and well-being is a core strand that runs right through the academy, ensuring our students grow into exceptional young adults. The Academy places great importance on creativity and expression, nurturing talent and opening minds.

Learning is brought to life at Stanchester Academy by teachers whose passion for their subjects is reflected in the opportunities they provide their students.

The Duke of Edinburgh Award

Learning new skills, being a valued member of the community, being able to solve problems and lead others are core values which are promoted through our significant involvement in the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme.

From the moment students enter the academy they will be building their portfolio of skills, achieving their first award at the end of year 7 and developing this portfolio to complete their bronze and silver awards in their latter years at Stanchester.

The Stanchester Baccalaureate

Our Baccalaureate promotes the belief that there are three strands of educational excellence:

- Academic excellence
- Personal development through skills for life
- Research based learning

The award, set at three levels, ensures all students are rewarded not only for their academic progress and commitment to their studies but also for their talents, the challenges they take on and their character development.



Support

Stanchester Academy has developed an incredible reputation over recent years for the support it provides for pupils. This level of support is made possible through our desire to remain a community centred school where class sizes and cohort sizes remain low enabling teachers to form incredible relationships with students.

As well as pastoral support being a great strength of the school for many years this is also true of support for children with emotional challenges, mental health challenges and special educational needs.

The support provided within our HUB (Helping You Belong) for students with SEND and the 'Green room' for those students who have support through the Pupil Premium fund is exceptional. Support is personalised, established through close links with various external agencies, as well as parents, and reviewed collaboratively at regular intervals.

Challenge

As well as providing exceptional support for those children facing a variety of challenges through their school life, the Academy also has a growing reputation for its innovative and inspiring programme for exceptionally able students. ‘The Edge Academy’ is a curriculum enrichment programme which inspires our students to aim high towards applying for places at Russell Group Universities, adding to the impressive tally of students graduating from prestigious universities over recent years.

The Edge Academy encourages students to partake in independent study programmes led by each department, mentored by members of staff and including excursions usually only accessible to the independent sector. Each year’s programme of work culminates in an award ceremony, reminding students that competition for places is a reality they will manage in their futures.



Transition The Stanchester Journey

The journey to Stanchester starts as early as possible to ensure the transition is smooth, anxieties are minimal and students start their education excited and happy. Staff and students at Stanchester work closely with our feeder primary schools, making regular visits, inviting children to events at the academy and hosting activities, sometimes even teaching lessons in our feeder schools.

More formally every child attends our fantastic 'Wow Day' long before admissions to secondary school take place, enabling children to understand a little about secondary school life and to familiarise themselves with the surroundings and staff before thoughts turn to actual transition to the phase.

At Stanchester we pride ourselves on the positive transition our children make, including now taking part in a transition curriculum which serves as a 'half way house' between the primary school curriculum and traditional secondary school curriculum, reducing the number of teachers students have during their first year and combining subjects into exciting, cross curricular themes which all include an experience day where parents can join their children in school – seeing for themselves the incredible opportunities their children are presented with at Stanchester.
